In the fantastical Zygotic Sun Energy, 2019, Toronto-based artist Winnie Truong (b.1988) vividly captures one of her self-described "wimmin creatures"—mythical figures that are part-plant, part-woman—enfolded by exuberant foliage. These flourishing life forms are animated by the life-giving energy of the sun, whose surface is teeming with wild flowers. Using coloured pencil crayon and cut paper collage, Truong explores the relationship between nature and idealized representations of the female form, creating surreal images and narratives that are at once stunningly beautiful and subversive.
