





In 2019, Vancouver-based artist Sandeep Johal (b.1975) created a series of vibrant, lively illustrations for Stories for South Asian Supergirls, an inspiring project created by Raj Kaur Khaira. With entries dedicated to trailblazing women in every domain, from the arts to community activism, this compilation centralizes the "intelligence, bravery and talent" of South Asian women. In the entry pictured here, Johal depicts the illustrious painter Amrita Sher-Gil (1913–1941), an icon of Modern art in India who has been celebrated for her achievements around the world.

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
